### **ENG 111 – Principles of Effective Writing I**

4 hours, 3 credits

An English composition course designed to provide students with intensive writing and basic skills practice. Emphasis will be placed on organization, logic, coherence, and focus, as well as on grammatical correctness, sentence structure, and paragraph development.

# **AST 101 – Introduction to Astronomy**

3 hours, 3 credits

Basic exploration of our universe and the laws that govern it. History and origins of the universe, life-cycles of stars and galaxies, properties of the sun and planets, the motion of the earth and its effect on seasons and astronomical observation.

#### **POL 166 – The American Political System**

3 hours, 3 credits

The theory and practice, and the form and substance, of American government and politics.

#### LEH 100 - Freshman Seminar

3 hour, 3 credits

Assists entering freshman in understanding and appreciating the nature of the educational process upon which the student is embarking. Aims to develop students' awareness of the unfolding dimensions of their education and its relationships to Lehman's General Education curriculum. Students will also begin developing the skills of using information and media sources in academic studies and for intellectual purposes.
